

Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA)

The Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) is a standard of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the assessment of chemicals, their risks and environmental impacts and for the prevention or avoidance of such.

In 2016, EPA identified five polybutylene terephthalate (PBT) chemicals for accelerated measures to prevent the use of these substances:

2,4,6-Tris(tert-butyl)phenol (2,4,6-TTBP)	732-26-3
Hexachlorobutadiene (HCBD)	87-68-3
Pentachlorothiophenol (PCTP)	133-49-3
decaBDE decabromodiphenylether	1163-19-5
Phenol isopropylated Phosphate (PIP)	68937-41-7
